

BARNSTABLE COUNTY ASSEMBLY OF DELEGATES

Resolution 91-22

Barnstable County is extraordinarily disappointed by the MWRA vote that rejected the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for a Technical Assistance Grant.

1) County officials were assured that the funds were forthcoming. In good faith, we expended time, energy and money (in terms of staff time) to develop the MOU and the RFP.

2) There is insufficient data for sound public policy decision making especially in regard to nutrient loading.

3) To date we have been excluded from the process; we require technical support and data to be fully involved.

4) We have strived to work with the MWRA yet the vote serves to further polarize the MWRA and the Cape.

5) We would like to remind you that this is your outfall pipe, not ours. You have an obligation to assist Cape Cod in efforts to protect Massachusetts Bay, the economy and the environment.

Now therefore,

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Barnstable County Assembly of Delegates that:

The Barnstable County Assembly of Delegates, the legislative branch of County Government representing the fifteen towns on Cape Cod, ask that you reconsider your decision by another vote of the full MWRA Board.
